Statement of Faith

WE BELIEVE:

Statement of Purpose

Ebenezer Bible Institute exists to provide Christian education primarily for Christians who have experienced a call to the ministry. The Institute seeks to develop the student in four areas: Spiritually, Intellectually, Socially, and Physically. The curriculum is geared toward providing the tools necessary for Christian service. Upon successful completion of the program, the student will achieve the following:

- 1. A well-rounded Christian life that is consistent with the Word of God as he or she develops a deeper understanding of the power of the Gospel through prayer, personal study of the Scriptures, worship, and service.
- 2. A comprehensive knowledge and accurate understanding of the Bible as the infallible Word of God.
- 3. A life fully committed to God with the Bible as the basis for conduct and Christian maturity.
- 4. Knowledge and practical skills necessary to communicate the gospel to mankind to build up the community of God's people.

Philosophy of Education

Ebenezer Bible Institute believes that God gives all truth and the capacity for knowledge. A Christian, therefore, is expected to show himself approved unto God. The Institute believes that true knowledge is in harmony with the Bible, and the Bible is God's revelation to man. Further, the biblical account of creation, man, and redemption is accurate, and the Bible is fundamental to all Christian education.

The philosophy of education as perceived by Ebenezer Bible Institute is that the educational process should be geared toward the development of the total personality, body, mind, and spirit. It provides the basis for the formation of Christian character and the standard for a right relationship with God and with one's fellow man.

The Ebenezer Bible Institute is committed to the Evangelical, Pentecostal, and Holiness faith of the Church of God as expressed in the Statement of Faith. In conjunction with our Motto, "Answering the Call So That They Can Answer the Call," the Institute's mission is to train men and women to become Christian leaders in their respective generations.

Admission Procedures and Requirements

For each admission to the Ebenezer Bible Institute, the prospective student must meet the following requirements:

- 1. Each student must complete an application form and submit it to the office with a one-time, non-refundable registration fee of \$20.00.
- 2. Each applicant must have a personal relationship with Christ and have a sound Christian testimony.
- 3. If attending from another church, a letter of recommendation from your pastor is necessary.
- 4. Submit a brief biographical sketch of your life as a Christian, including details of your conversion experience.
- 5. Submit two passport photographs.

Non-Discriminatory Policy Statement

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Curriculum and Course Description

BIBLE & THEOLOGY

Bible 101 - An Entry Level Course (offered free of charge)

Bible 101 is offered as an entry-level course for young converts and students who are new to Christianity and the Bible. The course focuses on providing basic biblical knowledge and can also be used by any local congregation as their young converts' class. The class will be conducted via a Zoom classroom and offered free to all who register for it. Bible 101 class will be repeated every six weeks.

Biblical Beliefs (co-published as Biblical Faith)

This course presents foundational Bible doctrines in a popular, easy-to-understand format. Topics covered in this course include creation and the fall of man, faith and regeneration, justification and adoption, prayer and worship, angels, Satan, resurrection and judgment, and the church.

New Testament Survey (co-published as Exploring the New Testament)

This course brings unity and chronological sequence to New Testament study by weaving the contents of the Books around a central theme—the person of Christ. Divisions are the synoptic Gospels, the Gospel of John, the Book of Acts, the Pauline Epistles in chronological order, the General Epistles, and the Book of Revelation.

Old Testament Part 1 (Genesis-Esther) and Old Testament Part 2 (Job-Malachi)

These two courses, taken together, provide a sweeping overview of God's workings from creation through the books of poetry and prophecy. The textbook entitled "Exploring the Old Testament," is utilized for both courses and includes topics such as the patriarchs, Israel's trek to the Promised Land, David's reign, Solomon's kingdom, the kingdom of Judah, the exile, and the return from captivity. Poetry and prophecy are explored to gain insight into God's dealings with

His people and relate these great writings of the prophets to us today. With a chronological sequence of events, historic and contextual information is readily grasped.

The Triune God (co-published as The One True God)

This course covers the individuality of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and the biblical teaching of the Trinity. Topics include the character/work of God; the preexistence, incarnation, deity, death, resurrection, and return of Christ; and the personality and power of the Holy Spirit.

You and Your Bible

(co-published as Exploring the Basics of the Bible)

Believers should be well informed about the Word of God. This course presents the inspiration and authorship of the Bible, how it was preserved, why we believe it, how we deal with its problems and critics, the role of archeology, and ways to study the Bible more effectively.

Christology

A detailed study of the life of Christ with special emphasis on His nature and work. Also discussing such matters as the Incarnation, the Resurrection, His human and divine natures and their relationship and His suffering, death, and resurrection.

Eschatology

A careful study of the Doctrine of last things including the Rapture and the Second Coming of Christ, the Revelation of the Antichrist and the Great Tribulation, the Millennial reign of Christ, the Great White Throne Judgment, and the end of this world and Heaven.

Ecclesiology

A brief study of the Christian church, the organizational structure, the role and functions of its officers and elders, the Holy Sacraments, ordinances, and the role of the Church in relation to mankind.

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MINISTRY SKILLS

Sunday School Ministry: The Church at Study

This course clarifies the traditional purposes, functions, and organization of the local church program known as Sunday School. It covers all aspects of the ministry of bringing children, youth, and adults to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ, enriching their Christian lives, and preparing them to serve Christ.

Church Educational Ministries: More Than Sunday School

This course provides a panorama of educational ministries in the local church—Sunday School, home Bible studies, summer ministries, retreats and camps, adult education, youth and club programs, children's church, and missions. It presents each program's uniqueness, strengths, structure, and resources.

Growing Toward Spiritual Maturity

A strategy for growing toward Christ-likeness must be based on the actual ways that people grow and develop into maturity in Christ. Through identifying and understanding how we grow spiritually, this course will help us to become more intentional in Bible study, prayer, lifestyle choices, evangelism, and spiritual gifts.

Teaching Techniques

This course focuses on the philosophical basis of methodology, looks at current learning theory research from a biblical perspective, and gives practical information on how to select and use various methods, including lecture, storytelling, panel discussion, simulation learning, group discussion, and others. It is a companion volume to the course Understanding Teaching.

Teaching Adults with Confidence

This course is designed to provide in-depth training for those who are teaching the Bible to adults. Course sessions answer the following questions: Why is it important to teach adults? What are the characteristics of adults at various stages of life? How do adults

learn, and how should they be taught? What are the key principles for organizing adult classes? By answering these questions, you can be better equipped to teach adults.

Teaching Youth with Confidence

The challenge to teach today's teens begins with understanding them as learners. This course defines the climate for learning, developmental characteristics of teens, the current youth culture, and critical issues in youth ministry. It also equips teachers to lead teens to make their Christian faith their own.

Understanding Music & Worship in the Local Church

Written with the layperson in mind, this course focuses on the important role of music and worship in the life of the church. It provides a historical overview of music and worship, biblical foundations for both, and practical instruction on how to renew both within the local church.

Understanding Teaching

A biblical understanding of teaching brings an appreciation for this spiritual gift. Approaching this task biblically involves empowerment from the Holy Spirit, insight into God's Word, sharp communication skills, and accurate interaction with students. It is a companion volume to Teaching Techniques.

VBS & Other Summer Ministries

The summer months provide time for creative expression of faith, concentrated Bible study, evangelism, and family reinforcement. Traditional Vacation Bible Schools have a new appearance. Other ministries, to all age groups, are giving birth to fresh ideas for spiritual development and boosting attendance.

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LEADERSHIP SKILLS

Christian Ethics in a Postmodern World

For the Christian, ethics must be rooted in the absolutes revealed in God's Word to inform and nurture our moral conduct. Followers of Christ must learn to think biblically. A Christian approach to complex ethical topics in the postmodern era challenges us to identify how we relate to culture.

Effectively Leading: A Guide for All Church Leaders

There are a wide variety of areas with which volunteer and professional church leaders must contend today. This course explains the difference between effective leaders and those who are efficient and what this means to the local church.

Perspectives From Church History (co-published as Exploring Church History)

Written as a basic introduction to the subject, this course covers the four major periods of church history: the Ancient Church, Medieval Church, Reformation Church, and Modern Church. It is designed to give Christians an oversight of their spiritual heritage.

Understanding People

To truly understand people, we must combine the rigorous formal study of developmental issues with our own observations and thorough study of Scripture. As biological, cognitive, socio-emotional, and spiritual ministry implications are addressed for each major age division, this course helps the Bible teacher to work with all ages of people more effectively.

OUTREACH SKILLS

Beyond Reasonable Doubt (co-published as Evidence and Truth)

Aside from personal faith in God, is there any evidence to substantiate the claims of Christianity? You be the judge! This text is an introduction to the study of apologetics. It will take you step-by-step through the well-documented evidence in support of Christian beliefs and Scripture. Whether a skeptic or a believer, this book will help you reach a verdict—that could very well change your life!

The Truth About Worldviews: A Biblical Understanding of Worldview Alternatives

In a world where multiple "truths" abound, Christians need to be on their guard to avoid being deceived by ways of looking at the world that directly oppose Christ and His Word. To be prepared, they must be well informed of these other worldviews and how they differ from Christianity. This course analyzes the main world religions, cults, and philosophical systems as worldviews and compares them to biblical Christianity.

World Missions Today

This course offers a historical survey of missions with emphasis on the present worldwide scene, the biblical basis of missions, and the ways all believers can get involved. Every believer's life will be enriched with the knowledge of God's work through His people around the world.

Your Ministry of Evangelism

Evangelism is the mandate for church growth today. This course covers the biblical foundations of evangelism, conversion and regeneration, how to lead a person to a decision for Christ, age-specific techniques, team efforts, visitation, discipling new believers, and the importance of prayer to the overall program of evangelism.

Graduation Requirements

Before students are approved for graduation, the following requirements must be met:

- 1. Completion of the entire year's academic program with a G.P.A. of 2.0 on a 0-4 point grading scale. All failure (F) or Incomplete (I) must also be removed from all transcripts prior to graduation.
- 2. Have perfect attendance or no more than two absences per year.
- 3. The successful completion of a community project that will be assigned.
- 4. Participation in some form of practical ministry.
- 5. Life and testimony must reflect sound Christian principles.

Attendance

Each student is allowed only two absences per year for any reason. Any absences above this will have to be approved by the instructor and supported by the appropriate makeup work. Students are also expected to be on time for class, which begins at 7:00 pm (Eastern Standard Time) on Monday nights. During the winter months, the time will be 8:00 pm (Eastern Caribbean Time). Tardiness is unacceptable (no exceptions). Zoom classes will be offered on the same night and at the same time. Log in information will be sent to the student after a successful registration.

Awards

There will be two awards given at the end of the school year—the VALEDICTORIAN AWARD and the STUDENT OF THE YEAR AWARD. The Valedictorian Award will be given to the student who has demonstrated outstanding academic, spiritual, and social qualities.

The Student of the Year Award will be given to the student who, in the opinion of the student body and faculty, posses very high values, principles, and Christian standards, and who has been most helpful and cooperative to the other students.

Students' Association

Students are advised to meet at the beginning of every school year and elect officers for a Students' Association. These officers are:

The Students' Association shall exist for the following purposes:

- 1. To establish a closer working relationship between faculty and the student body.

- 5. To raise funds for the Institute.
- 6. To be involved in various projects that will assist in promoting the quality education, which the Institute offers.


